

This was a great guidebook to bring on my recent trip to St. Petersburg for suggestions for activities/sights, food, shopping, and getting around. I found my own hotel online, but the book(s) was really useful for dining and for planning my time. Unless you're hiring a guide or audio guides to explain the museums and sights, I suggest also purchasing the Rick Steves' snapshot guide that covers St. Petersburg. He does an unmatched job of explaining what you see in an engaging way. If you're only visiting the one city, consider doing the digital download, so that you're not carrying around a second book the whole time just for like 90 pages or so of content.
