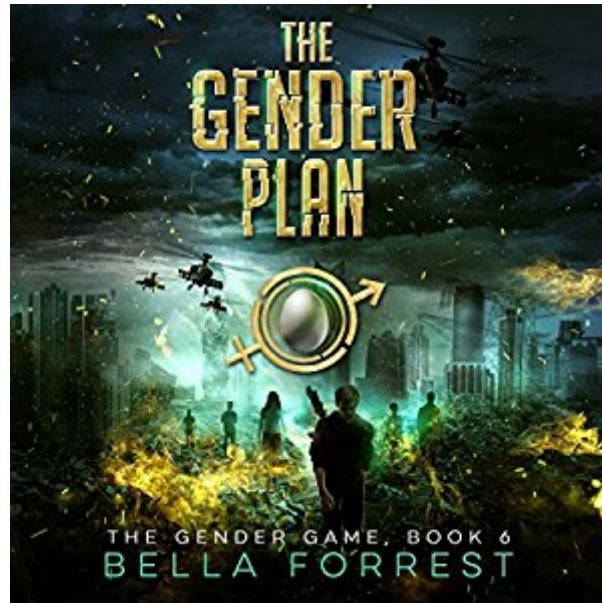




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The Gender Plan: The Gender Game, Book 6

The last book had ended in such a huge cliffhanger and I was looking forward to seeing how Bella would carry on with the series. The moment this one came out I couldn't help but jump right into it. The first part of the book was super fast paced and I got through I think 30% percent of it within an hour. I couldn't stop reading and I just wanted to know what was going to happen. I couldn't believe how intense it was and how much I was enjoying it. The characters as always are in constant danger and on several occasions it seems as if they aren't going to get through it. I would have to say the character development wasn't huge in this one, but I still really enjoyed getting back in the story with Violet and Viggo, especially Viggo. I think his character is really great and I really loved seeing how he was dealing throughout all of this and his relationship with the other characters, especially this one who blames him for a family member's death. There were several character I wish we could have gotten to know more. There were newer ones that had a lot of potential, but I'm hoping we'll get to see them more in the next book and their character growth. I really liked where Bella was going with this story and I enjoyed all the meetings we got to sit in on with the characters and see them strategize. I think worldbuilding and story wise this was her best in the series because she has just set up for so much to happen and I'm looking forward to see how she'll execute it all in her last book. Okay, so now I'm going to go onto what I didn't like. I feel like I'm betraying this series for not liking it as much, but it just felt like the author got a little unfocused in the middle of the book. I love Viggo and Violet. They are such awesome characters and I have loved seeing how their relationship has grown and how they've been opening up to each other over time. I still really did love their characters in this book, just not when they were together or thinking about each other. It was really frustrating, because I just love them so much together, but in this book whenever they were in the same room all they could think about was each other and how wonderful they looked and how much they loved it each and while this is great, I still wish it would have been a deeper relationship and it just seemed really out of character for them.

Yes, there have been similar moments in each book, but they were never so drawn out and they were more focused on what was going on around them. I just thought the author could have focused so much more on developing their relationship, especially since Violet hasn't ever really had one and Viggo's first wife was killed and he blames himself a lot about this. This whole aspect of the book just seemed so out of character for them both and I thought there were other things the author could have focused on. Now there wasn't much else I didn't enjoy, but there was other really big thing that I didn't think was necessary. There was this scene where one of the boys who's been experimented on comes up to Violet and Viggo and asks them what sex is. I remember it felt like I was hitting my breaks and squealing to stop when I read this. Why was this necessary? Again, there is a war going on and something tells me this wouldn't be the big question on this person's mind, I think maybe death and wondering if his loved ones were going to die would have come before wondering what sex is. I really, really didn't like this and just this scene dropped a star for me because it felt so unnecessary. At this point the story was really lagging and they were pretty much just sitting around wondering what to do next, but just when things seemed to be going nowhere the pacing started to pick up again and we were moving forward. The last fifteen to twenty chapters were awesome. I was back to being on the edge of my seat, clutching my kindle in my hand and biting my nails. It was back to being super intense I was enjoying it again so much. This is when I was really enjoying the story and the characters. I would still totally recommend this book. It turned out I still really enjoyed this book, just not as much as the others, which makes me sad, but I will be reading the next one and I'm hoping it's a lot better, especially since she's given us until July for it to be released. This series could've likely fit into four books, maybe even three. As the series continues the story lines gets stretched out farther and farther until it gets to be so slow I find myself skipping huge chunks of the book because so much of what's happening feels like filler. I've unfortunately been able to skip huge parts of several of these books and still know what is happening wherever I choose to jump in later on. To me, that speaks of the slow nature of the story. Truly, I've enjoyed the series as a whole, but the boredom I experience throughout the middle portion of the books is painful. There was a lot of long-winded planning, scheming, and moving of chess pieces, so to speak, in this book. I felt like nothing much happened and the story was being stretched beyond its limits. I keep reading the books because I want to know what happens to Violet and company, but feel decidedly less excited about the final book after reading this one. I am holding out hope the next book has less fluff and more substance and action.
