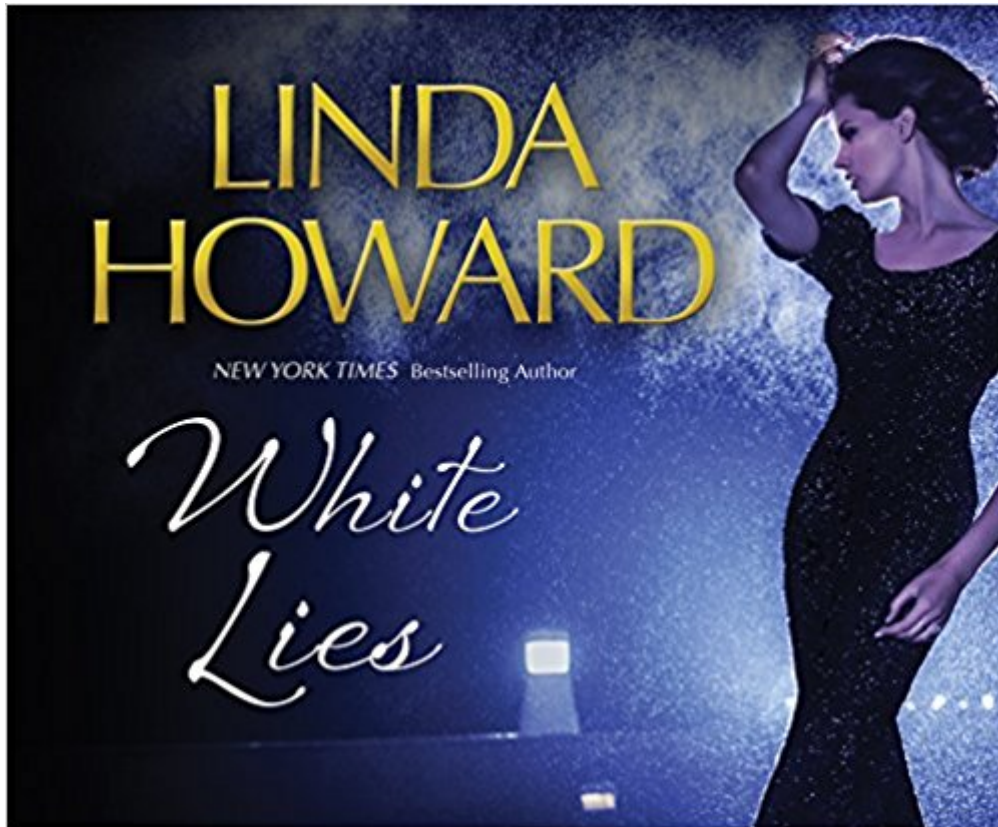




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White Lies



Synopsis

I thought this was kind of a thin story. LH showed a lot of skill, keeping my interest when the hero was, for the first half of the story, lying in a coma, almost completely swaddled in bandages. Even on the verge of death, his strength of character, his refusal to succumb and his responsiveness to her presence forged a deep bond with Jay, the heroine. But when he opened his eyes after the bandages were removed, Jay was stunned to realize that he wasn't her ex-husband (from whom she divorced five years ago) - but a total stranger. Now, this was where it made no sense. Jay now knew she'd incorrectly identified him as her ex-husband Steve. The government agents surrounding them (in particular, Payne) had known from the beginning the real identity of the man in a coma. Payne and The Man just wanted to protect their agent (the comatose guy) from the bad guys by shielding him with Jay's dead ex's identity. So why didn't they anticipate that Jay would know he was not Steve, now that she had seen his eyes? LH's apparent explanation was that both men had brown eyes; therefore Jay would still think he was her ex. And that was supposed to be the "little" detail the FBI, Payne and The Man etc., had overlooked. Hello? All brown eyes are exactly the same? Jay knows Steve's eyes were a deep brown, but the strange hospital patient whose hand she'd been holding throughout his stay turned out to have yellowish brown eyes. I guess because his face has been injured and altered, that's the reason they think Jay won't recognize him even with the bandages removed from his eyes. This absurdly weak spot in the plot kept some part of my mind preoccupied in puzzling over it instead of remaining deeply absorbed in the narrative. Not LH's best work - by far. The rest of the book was "Steve's" attempting to overcome his total amnesia and Jay's battling her guilt that she refused to tell him the truth, for his own protection - and because she didn't want the charade to end so she'd be sent away and lose him. Yeah - pretty lame. Of course, she gives in to his sexual demands despite her guilt. Jay came across as needy, desperate and dishonest. Lucas (he eventually remembered his real name) came across as having bonded with a woman just because she held his hand when he was helpless. I felt deeply skeptical that their bond was real, deep or enduring. The only reason I gave this book 3 stars instead of two, was because LH did a fabulous job describing Lucas and making his virility and sexual appeal so potent. He lacked refinement or sensitivity, but was completely convincing as a lethal, high value secret agent and as a man who made "women fall all over themselves" (as described by Payne). Too bad the hot affair (and marriage) between J and L seemed doomed (in my opinion) to a swift end. The whole story made little sense.

FINAL DECISION: An enjoyable story of a woman who falls in love with a man thought to be her

ex-husband but then she isn't quite sure that he is. **THE STORY:** Jay Granger's life changes when the FBI comes to her door to tell her that her ex-husband has been in a terrible accident and that they need her to come identify him. Although they have been divorced for five years, Jay cannot abandon Steve Crossfield. She is drawn to the man in the hospital bed but when he wakes he seems so different from the man she remembers loving before. **OPINION:** This story is not complicated and I figured out quickly what was happening, but the story is well executed and the characters are so interesting that I was engaged throughout the story. This book was originally published as a category romance and thus lacks some of the sophistication and complexity allowed in a longer novel. I liked these characters who fell in love without really knowing the truth about what happened to Steve. The connection of these characters is visceral -- a recognition of spirits. The real mystery in this one is how the truth about Steve's actions and identity will be revealed and what that will make for the hero and heroine.
