But I will also say that it's very good. And, if you like Levi and/or Erwin, it's definitely worth picking up.I was not expecting this to be how Levi and Erwin first met, or how Levi got started with the Survey Corps, and it definitely gives me a new perspective on Levi. I think I like him even more now.Levi is a thief at the start of this book, along with two friends that I've never met before. They live underground, in a very rundown area. The survey corps are struggling, and Erwin takes it upon himself to do something new, including recruiting Levi (and his friends). Levi is awesome from the start, of course, and his friends take very close behind him, even though the others aren't very welcoming.I don't recognize Levi's friends, and that makes me wary of if something happens to them. I honestly didn't pay much attention to Erwin in the original series, and he still doesn't really have my affection, but he's an interesting

character. I'm getting a new insight on his and Levi's relationship, and that's interesting. I was also hoping that we'd get to see more of Hange, particularly how her and Levi meet and grow close. Hange is a really interesting character, and very close to Levi in the original. We saw glimpses of Hange in this volume, so I hope there's more in the next volume. I want to see their first real interaction. Also, the art was very pretty. It still had some of the harsh edges and shadowing that the original has, which I appreciated, but it was also much prettier. The next volume is the last in this spin-off, and I look forward to seeing how Levi's prequel wraps up.

I'm relatively new to Attack on Titan and Levi is my favorite character. I'm not entirely caught up with the regular series (which I love so far) but I had to pick up this mini series about "Humanity's Strongest Fighter". I enjoyed this manga but I was kind of hoping for some more on Levi than what was provided here. I guess it was just a little more one-dimensional than the main series or the anime. Levi is pretty much introduced as the same character he is in the main series, but this one happens before he joins the Survey Corps. So there is not a lot of backstory on where he came from or how he came to be a thief in the underground. No spoilers from me here but Levi becomes kind of obsessed with getting revenge against someone who humiliates him in the beginning of the story and that is more or less his motivation for the rest of the books. To me, Levi is more cerebral and perceptive than that, but in this story he is kind of forced into doing things which doesn't seem so much like him. I wish there was more of Hange Zoe because I love her, but what there is of her is excellent (mostly in the second volume). Anyway, if you like Levi and want to read anything and everything with him in it, you won't be disappointed and it is quite fun. However, don't expect any ground shaking stuff.

If you're an attack on Titan fan or just really enjoy Levi, then this is a must read for you. Finishing off where volume 1 left off, has Levi and company wondering what's truly going on and if they were being set up. It shows what made Levi truly hate the titans and why he's so vicious against them (but honestly who wouldn't). It's nice to know more about Levi's past. I hope they make an anime adaption of these books!

In the second and final dedicated manga to Levi's backstory we are given his rationale for remaining in the Scouting Regiment and why he is so loyal to Erwin. The events in this book are fairly obvious to those whom are familiar with the series, yet are rendered in an extremely compelling and heart

wrenching way it's hard to not emphasize with Levi's feelings. The art is also quite well done and owing in part partially to how it was not on as much of a time crunch to be serialized for a while is actually better in some ways than the main manga though in all fairness there were of course fewer time constraints for "Gun Snark" and Co. and it's on less of a scale so as to focus on getting you to know Levi's companions. All in all it was everything you could expect and more and for any AoT fan this is required reading if you want to gleam why Levi is the way he is.
