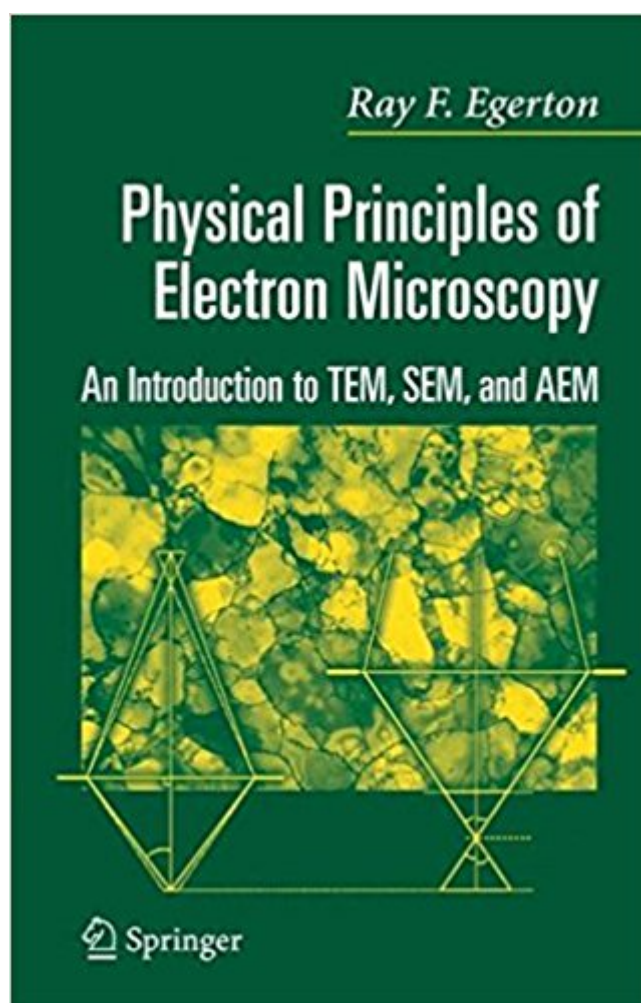


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Physical Principles Of Electron Microscopy: An Introduction To TEM, SEM, And AEM
