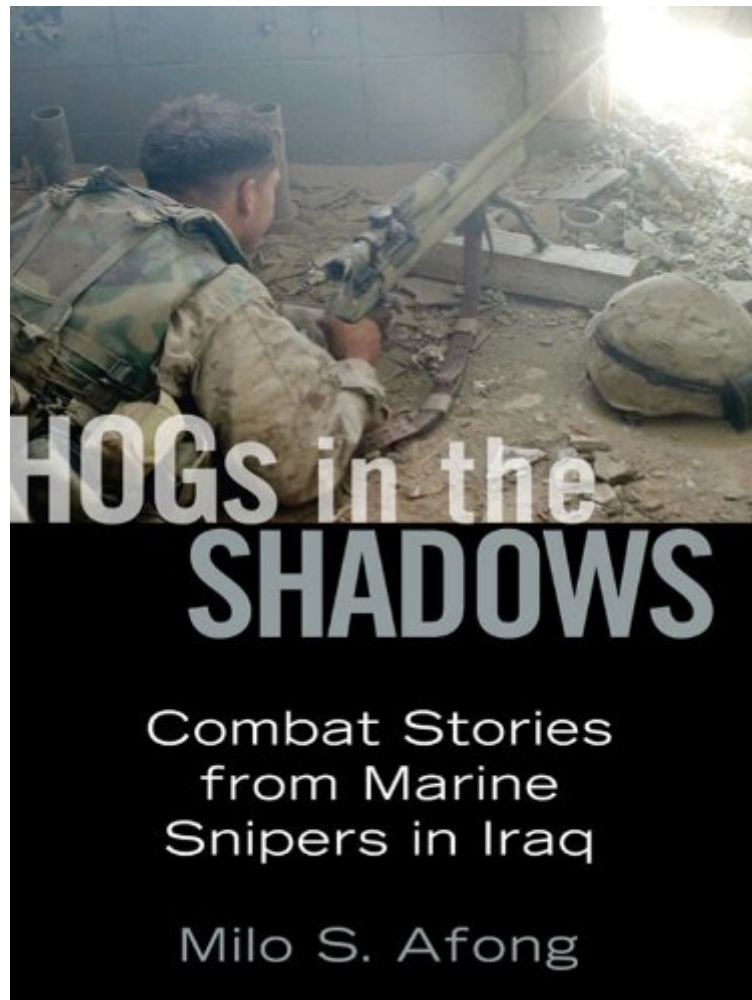




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Hogs In The Shadows: Combat Stories From Marine Snipers In Iraq

This is a good book that tells a lot of stories of assumed real experiences that various snipers and sniper teams have had in Iraq. It is setup where each chapter in it deals with a different sniper's story, with details about that person at the heading of each chapter. There is not a story like

progression through the book as it is accounts of events that have taken place in each sniper's experience in Iraq. Sometimes you will hear stories from the same events told in different points in time but otherwise there is not a normal beginning, middle, and end here. Where the book excels is giving you a non-watered down media version of what the war in Iraq was really like. There are things you read here that represent the horrors of war as well as things that show the heroism of the men involved in them. I was especially moved by one story of a highly skilled physically fit young sniper whose life was changed in an instant when he lost movement in one of his arms from an IED explosion. This book made me appreciate even more the sacrifice that everyone in combat makes and how much they should be appreciated for it. Since these are separate accounts but all on the same basic subject, the stories can get repetitive by the time you get to the end of the book. Each one is a different enough however to warrant reading, especially if like me you love reading stories about snipers in combat. If you do not like this kind of stuff then you may get bored with the repetitive elements.

I read a lot, but this book told me real stories of snipers in Iraq and Fallujah, what they did and how they did so. I know that on X-Box one and 360 I have always enjoyed taking the sniper position, however this book tells a great story of our dear, beloved defenders of our country, and my hat and heart goes out to each of the eleven men that this book tells about in a chapter by chapter version. It made one chapter about one man's war, including situations that named and included other soldiers, but it told specifically about one man in each chapter and I could get interrupted by work etc., and not feel like I was missing the story by not reading the entire book at once.
