

The author describes in great detail 50 hikes, which my travel partner and I narrowed down to three. Our visit to Montreal lasted only two days so we ended up doing just two hikes: Parc Mont Real and Mont St. Hilaire. Both were delightful and met his descriptions, although we would have liked a big and detailed map of Mont Real. We got confused coming down. One other regret was that the book was limited to the area around Montreal. We also were traveling to Quebec and would have loved comparable descriptions of the hikes there.

This is a thorough and detailed guide book and I look forward to many hikes in the future with my brother-in-law and nephews. Great book.
