This book had so much potential, however, the author just doesn't seem to be interested in editing,

re-reading for typos, grammar, punctuation, etc. It's surprising how this writer is already into Book 7 of this series and hasn't taken the time to re-read her work to fix things! I recall reading Book 3 in this series and was disappointed by the same sort of mistakes. The writer obviously doesn't care about the reader(s) getting tripped up by glaring errors. As I started writing: This book had so much potential. I have a list of authors that I won't pick up again simply because of their writing. Jenny Wood is being added to that list. I struggled to give this book 3 stars, the cover earned it that 3rd star! Nice looking guy!

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Great series, but, it is in need of serious editing. Grammatical errors, (...so that's what I done. /...which is exactly what I done./Well, Max and I was wondering... And more in the same vein). Also words left out of sentences and sentences that don't make any sense such as, I was going to be under contract Dax's his PI team... Rereading what you've written or having another person beta reading your work Before you publish should be a given. Possibly understandable if it is you're a newbie author, but not so understandable if you've published as many books as Jenny Wood has. Her stories are engrossing, her characters are memorable, and her storylines are well put together. I also like that characters from previous books make integral appearances in following books in a series. All in all, I will continue to read this author's works because I like her characters and storylines. I just hope she cleans up her editing.

I've given almost the same review for all the books in this series. The storylines are great, the characters are interesting and would deserve five stars if not for the editing. This is the seventh book in this series. I just don't understand why it is so hard to get someone who knows a little more about grammar to proofread before publishing. It's better than the first books. However, there are still way too many instances where the wrong form of a word is used, spelled or typed incorrectly, or the punctuation is in the wrong place. The punctuation makes it confusing at times. It breaks the flow of the story when you have to pause to decipher what was REALLY meant. I just don't understand why the author can't fix this. If she's using an editor, it's time to get a new one. I really want to be able to give the five stars her storytelling deserves.

I have read several of this author's books. I really want to love them, but I can't. The storylines are always so promising, the characters have potential to be awesome. They always feel a little rushed. Like they got tired of writing and just finished that interaction or situation. The killer for me though is the grammar. Poor sentence structure, horrible attempts to hide incredibly bad grammar as regional 'character'. No, it's just poor grammar. College educated professionals don't talk or think that way, but nice try. Also, many of the characters aren't from the region you've put them in and weren't raised there. So I won't be trying more of them praying I'll suddenly see improvement.

What a fantastic read! The beginning of the story had me in tears and I appreciated the low key attraction or sexual tension between Evan and Jury because it made what Evan went through and his pain and his slow recovery more believable. Maybe two or so erotic scenes and that was peddle to for me because the story truly focused on the characters and their emotional development towards each other and the very less than perfect miserable situation Evan had to face. Lovely tale.

From the beginning this series has pulled me in and it just gets better and better! Before each new book I re-read the rest of the books and fall in love with all the guys all over again! Would definitely recommend Jenny Wood!!

This would have been a decent four star book if it had been edited. Alas, it wasn't. The punctuation was horrific, there were misspelled words and a number of instances where homophones were used, eg patients instead of patience, speck instead of spec, etc. I strongly encourage the author to have the book edited, and once that's done, I'd be happy to recommend it to others to read.

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
