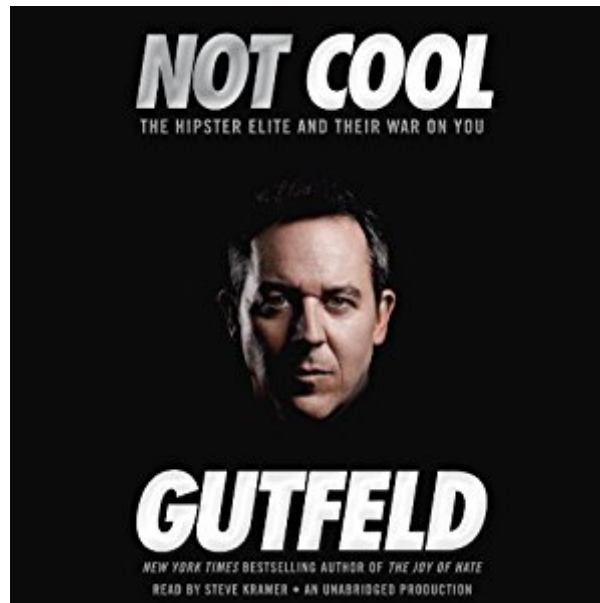

I have read several other of Gutfeld's books, and they were enjoyable, but I found this book, which really is a collection of different-length essays, to express observations that are so on the mark

about current times, that I am sending a copy to each of my three adult children, two of whom probably will read it. It helps to understand and enjoy this book, if one has seen at least a bit of Gutfeld on his late-night show, "Red Eye," or although less help, his appearances on Fox's "The Five." I say that because his style of writing is similar to how he presents information on television. That probably is because much of his televised appearances seems to be reading what is written. In short, although he appears on television, he seems to be more of a writer than a television personality, but the asides and contradictions presented for humorous effect, seem to be more understandable, and effective, when spoken than when written. (Gutfeld has been an editor of several magazines, and looking over my comment, it probably good use a good editor. I am good at that, but a bit lazy at the moment. Maybe I will come back and edit it later. Maybe not.)

One gets the impression that he was for the earlier part of his life accepting much of the so called cool view of the popular culture, and has through experience renounced it. Interspersed with self deprecating remarks about himself, it is an entertaining read and a refutation of the "cool" culture.
