

and a creepy carnival in *Sanctum* (2014, both HarperCollins), Dan, Abby, and Jordan are now seniors planning a final road trip together before going their separate ways. However, their fun attempt at forgetting the past soon goes awry as they clearly are being followed, and Dan starts receiving messages from an old friend who died. Roux's latest is interspersed with creepy black-and-white photographs. Give this to fans of the series or those who enjoy horror while they eagerly wait for next year's *Asylum Novellas* (a collection of three short stories about the bad guys of previous volumes) and *Escape from Asylum* (both HarperCollins) (a prequel story diving into Brookline's horrid past). --This text refers to an out of print or unavailable edition of this title.

Dan, Abby & Jordan are headed to New Orleans to drop Jordan off with his uncle. It's a cross-country road trip as kind of "their last hurrah" before they all go to college. Of course, Dan is still trying to figure out his past and he is plagued by spooky messages. They are also being followed, and someone is photographing them...So, I think this is the final book in the *Asylum* trilogy (not counting all the novellas from the same world). I read the first two books a while ago and I don't remember many details from them. I glanced at my reviews and that helped a bit. I loved the first two, but this one was a bit disappointing - I didn't get the creepiness. It does wrap up a few mysteries about Dan's past. I don't know what else to say, I guess this one was just meh.

As I read each book in this series, I think it must be the best because of the intricacies of the plot and how mesmerizing the story is. The only problem I had with this book was the inability to put it down. One of the best books I've ever read.
