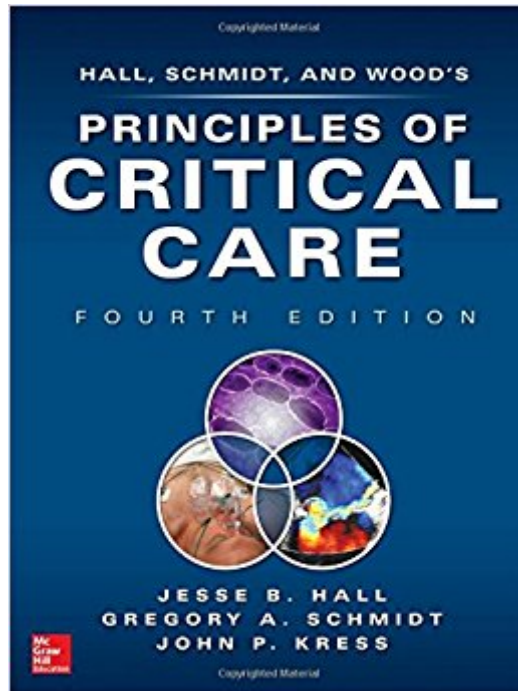

For example: it says from point D to E in figure 31-8 and there is no point E in figure 31-8! It doesn't explain the figures very well which makes it harder to understand them.
