The book for review is "Read with Me Bible: for Little Ones" by Doris Wynbeek Ridders and illustrated by Dennis G. Jones. This book falls in the genre of juvenile non-fiction, religious, Bible stories and general. This is a very durable book. The pages are okay for kids to be rough with due to the pages being made of cardboard like material. A baby teething wouldn't hurt it. The book contains select stories from the Bible. It ranges from the beginning with Adam and Eve and the Arc to David fighting Goliath, Jonah and the whale to Jesus being born. The stories are short and easy to read. A child who has learned to read can read this themselves. It's also a good book for parents to read to their child at night. It is a

good lead in for a child to learn about God and maybe spark their interest in learning and perhaps reading more. It's simple in design in the sense it won't go over their head or be too much for them. I would image a young one would be encouraged by the message inside instead of just reading and putting it down. The pages are colorful and wonderful for young ones to appreciate and enjoy over and over again. They are colorful and exciting to look at while the story is being read to a child. A nice introduction to learn and be introduced to the Bible. It's a quick read but will certainly be read many time. This is a nice gift to a young one if you want to start the education of the Bible to your child or young relative. “But the best creatures God made were people,” Doris Wynbeek Rikkers writes in her children's book, *Read with Me Bible for Little Ones*, which is illustrated by Dennis G. Jones. ~ What ~ This small thirty-two-page board book with a padded front cover targets four-to-eight-year-old children who enjoy reading Bible stories. Only a few visual pictures of an angry Goliath, Jonah falling into the water, and a scary storm may concern some young children. Due to some complicated wording, it would best be read out loud to beginner readers. This reviewer wishes all pronouns of God were capitalized for reverence. With colorful and expressive full-page illustrations, the easy-to-read font of black wording on white ovals with bright borders are on almost every page. Having four stories from both the Old and New Testaments of the Holy Bible, covered are creation, Noah's ark, David and Goliath, Jonah and the big fish, Jesus's birth, a day in the life of Jesus, His calming of the sea, and His ascension. ~ Why ~ With only a few sentences each, the eight Bible stories are short and to the point with smaller pictures included. I like the facial expressions with big eyes depicted and the “follow the red-dotted line” maze of Christ's day. ~ Why Not ~ Although the book does not have the eternal plan of salvation explaining that Christ died on the cross, each story has a limited amount of information. However, this may encourage dialogue with the child about God and Jesus. Some children may not like the buggy eyes throughout the book. ~ Who ~ With no information given on the author, illustrator Jones has designed many children's books, magazines, games, toys, and Sunday school curriculum. He and his wife live in Indiana. ~ Wish ~ With so much to view in each illustration, they will grab a young reader's attention, but I wish some of them were toned down a little as sometimes the scenes are too busy. ~ Want ~ If your toddler wants a Bible of their own that contains eight

Inculcating to our children good moral values using stories from the Bible is more fun with two learning materials from Zonderkids. I won't sugarcoat this: the Bible -- the thick, wordy version -- can be an intimidating book. Growing up, there was a scarcity of reading materials at home but my Mom made sure that we learn the stories of Jonah and the Whale, Daniel and the Lions, David and Goliath, the Birth of Jesus, the Story of Creation. She would show us the traditional Bible and then proceed to read the story with a colorful flare. She didn't have any props but my imaginative child's mind did the rest. Mom was good at storytelling and she encouraged reading even when buying books was not a top priority at home. She made sure though that we always had access to the required textbooks in school. She inspired us to attend regular church activities and learn more about our faith as Christians. Any parents of toddlers know that the period between one to three is marked with several developmental milestones; temper tantrums being one of them. Short attention span is a challenge during our Monday night Bible time as we enjoin the children to watch faith-based films with us. Since becoming a member of the Booklook Bloggers program, my family has been blessed with several reading materials which served as my tools and guide in sharing the Word of God to my children. Two of them arrived in my mailbox in the last week and I'm excited to share them to my children. Read with Me Bible for Little Ones have had requested books similar to this book in the last month but this is the only book that really caught the attention of my husband Jeff. He actually laughed! The reason for his glee? The illustrations. Dennis G. Jones is a drawing genius for making Bible characters fun and... fun! Seriously, the fish and the birds in the Story of Creation perked me up. Noah looked like a quirky grandpa and I mean that in a good way, while David looked like an anime hero with a can-do attitude. The texts which were, obviously, derived from the Bible was written by Doris Wynbeek Rikkers, make for an easy read-aloud sessions with children. Sentences are shorter and simple so you won't be tongue-tied and you won't run out of breath reading the story of Jonah and the Big Fish. This book featured eight stories from the Bible: four from the Old Testament and four from the New Testament. My favorite story that comes with the illustrations is "The Day in the Life of Jesus", which can be read in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Rikkers wrote the story in a shorter and simpler form. Doing so makes it easier for me to ask my children to repeat sentences such as "Jesus prayed to the Father", "Jesus loved little children", and "Jesus told a woman about living water". Again, illustrator Dennis Jones did a superb

job on this book. His contribution in this masterpiece cannot be overlooked. Adventure Bible (Wild About the Bible) Sticker and Activity Book This sticker and activity book is not a supplementary materials of Read with Me Bible for Little Ones. But I saw it in the list of books available for review and I thought: "Hmm... This one can be a great after reading activity." My twin toddlers love crayons and stickers and we often do activities in our learning corner at home that involves crayons and stickers. Hence, this book is a great addition to our growing library. I have to photocopy the pages though as we only have one copy of this book. I already decided to just make copy of the pages for our activities so we can repeat the activities whenever we want to. There are pages devoted for coloring, crossword puzzles, mazes, connect the dots, spot the differences, word scrambles, and secret codes. It really is a great companion for any Bible Book for Children! The pictures were the works of David Miles and they're pretty simple for children to understand especially in activities where they need to match a picture to a specific story sequence. Having these materials gave me several ideas on how I can further improve on the activities I included in the books I just finished writing.
