

Trouble In The Tribe: The American Jewish Conflict Over Israel



Synopsis

Trouble in the Tribe explores the increasingly contentious place of Israel in the American Jewish community. In a fundamental shift, growing numbers of American Jews have become less willing to unquestioningly support Israel and more willing to publicly criticize its government. More than ever before, American Jews are arguing about Israeli policies, and many, especially younger ones, are becoming uncomfortable with Israel's treatment of Palestinians. Dov Waxman argues that Israel is fast becoming a source of disunity for American Jewry, and that a new era of American Jewish conflict over Israel is replacing the old era of solidarity. Drawing on a wealth of in-depth interviews with American Jewish leaders and activists, Waxman shows why Israel has become such a divisive issue among American Jews. He delves into the American Jewish debate about Israel, examining the impact that the conflict over Israel is having on Jewish communities, national Jewish organizations, and on the pro-Israel lobby. Waxman sets this conflict in the context of broader cultural, political, institutional, and demographic changes happening in the American Jewish community. He offers a nuanced and balanced account of how this conflict over Israel has developed and what it means for the future of American Jewish politics. Israel used to bring American Jews together. Now it is driving them apart. Trouble in the Tribe explains why.

The book explores the relationship between U.S and Israeli Jewry in the context of the Arab-Israeli conflict and its implications on the relations between the communities at present and in the future. It shows how internal changes within the communities effect the dynamic between the two and then describes the possible ramifications for Israel as a whole as a result. Although I disagree with Professor Waxman on several points, the book is incredibly well written and I believe he does his best to remain objective until his final conclusion regarding the fragile future of American Jewry and its tenuous relationship with Israel. I think it is absolutely worth reading regardless of where you might fall on the political spectrum because his analysis with respect to the history of Israel's relationship with the American Jewish Community and American Jewry's relationship with the Zionist Movement in general is extremely well researched and he raises key issues that should concern us as Jews. I believe that Professor Waxman probably falls of the extreme left and a key point that I disagree with him on is his assessment of such organizations as the Jewish Voice for Peace. Unfortunately in this respect I think that he may accept the false historical narrative concerning how Israel was legitimately reestablished in 1948. Sadly a group like the Jewish Voice for peace unfortunately completely removes itself from the Jewish community by advocating for Israel's enemies calling for the destruction of the Jewish state. In their eyes nothing which Israel does is justified and they help spread the false claim of occupation, Apartheid and seek a one State solution where the Jews would no longer be the majority. Unlike Professor Waxman, I believe that any Jew who supports a group like the JVP is self hating and has no real sense of Jewish identity. It is not worth delving into all these points now but overall he has done a great job with this book and it is something that every Jew should read because it will broaden your view of the conflict between the extreme right and the extreme left in terms of how Israel has molded and shaped the growing divide within American Jewry over the last few decades. The bottom line is that it is an exceptional book and you will only benefit from reading what he has to say about the subject.
