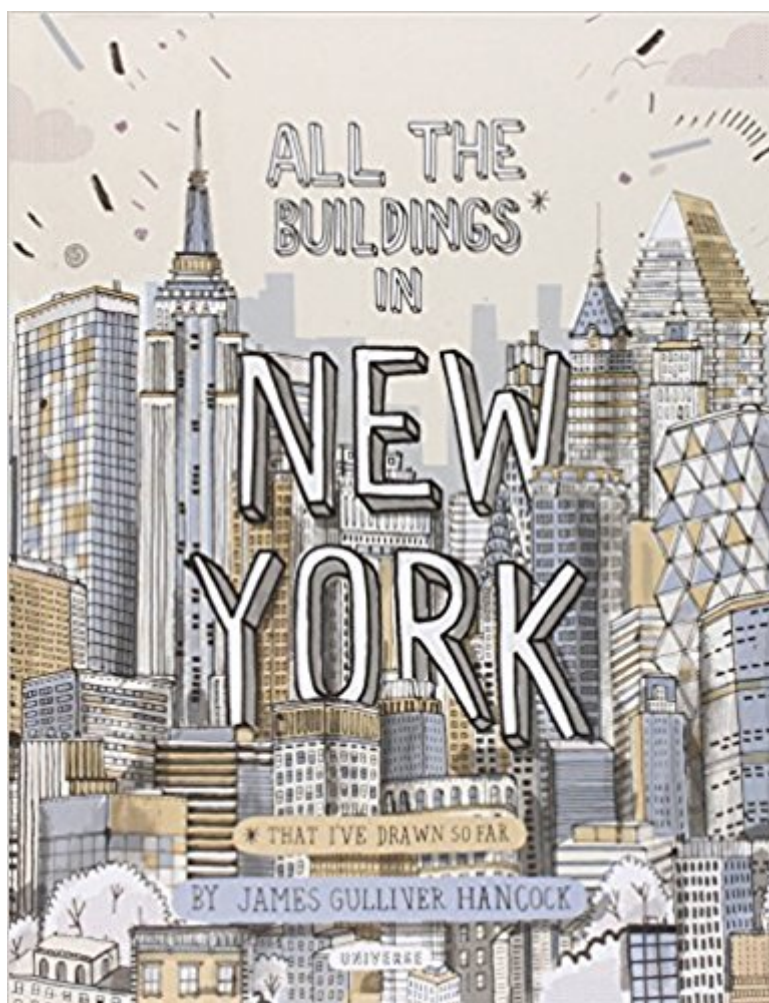

His work has been exhibited in galleries worldwide, and he has worked with a wide variety of high-profile clients, including Coca-Cola, the New York Times, and Herman Miller Furniture. He chronicles his attempt to draw every single building in New York City at the popular blog "All the Buildings in New York."

James Gulliver Hancock is an Australian who likes to travel. During his travels he would sketch obsessively the places he visits. All the Buildings in New York is an ongoing project and this book can be said to be born out of that. On his blog, he posts regularly of the buildings he drew. He hasn't reach all yet, hence the asterisk in the title, but he has managed to capture many of the iconic and also unknown ones. The book has only 64 pages. His style is simple and beautiful. There's a sort of cartoon vibe about the line work and colours. Even the non-eye catching ones have their own charm when presented as sketches. It's a pretty fun book to check out the diverse architectural styles. Of course there are the iconic buildings like Woolworth Building, New York Times Building, Hook and Ladder 8 where Ghostbusters was filmed, , Time Square, St Patrick's Cathedral, Chrysler Building, Rockefeller Center, Empire State Building, Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and more. There are

also the residential buildings that line the busy streets of Manhattan. Nice book to collect if you're into sketchbooks. (There are more pictures of the book on my blog. Just visit my profile for the link.)

We saw this book while on vacation and didn't have time to purchase it so when we got home we bought it on for a great price. It was a gift for our nephew who is a car designer and although he has never been to New York we thought he would admire the author's talent. He was both awed and inspired by it. It got such a rave review that we also purchased several more and sent them to friends who live in New York. This book is very unique and well done. Made us want to head to New York to use as a guide book to admire the artist's buildings.

I've met Mr. Hancock a few times at art events in LA and was very excited to hear he had finally published a book. Just got it from , and am very impressed with this young man's grasp of the mood of New York. I think this would be a great book for some of the building owners to give as gifts to tenants, and in my case I'm giving it as gifts this year to several people that I know who are hardcore New Yorkers. I know they will be thrilled.

To those reviewers who also wanted information about the buildings as well - this is not that book. It is explained how the book came about, pure and simple. This book is a very personal view of New York architecture through an illustrator's eyes. A visitor, he lived in New York for a few years, gradually drawing the buildings which caught his eye. The buildings seem alive, they have personality and style - a visual feast. This is a special book for those who know and love New York. Apparently, the author has even had commissions to do individual New Yorkers' own dwellings.
