I bought this book this afternoon, gave it a five minute window of reading time to grab my interest , and Voila- 3 hours later I gobbled up every last word and am now reviewing it! This story tells a more extreme experience in terms of coming of age tales; and yet, despite how painful it is to read Ashley trials, I could still relate and identify with this coming of age tale. Her fears and hopes, her one step forward two steps back experiences, her love for friend- they rang true. I was from a very overprotective family but watching less protected girls navigate the perils of social pressure, bullying, and sexual shaming was horrifying, and this story conjures up those horrors up without exploiting those themes like Young Adult lit so often do. And I liked the supernatural twist that allowed Ashley to hope and to envision an outcome that was more than her 17 year old self could imagine. I also loved the sliding doors angle, because it showed how our actions influence others- ie, the more Ashley expected from others the more others like Matt were given the opportunity to arise to the occasion. It was so nice to see a young adult book where the overly sexual bad boy is NOT the prize to be won but cast as the proper sociopathic villain he should be too(I'm looking right at you Finn!)

A very dark story; very well written. I, too, was bullied - during a time my mother was having her own psychological problems, hence no support to me. Nightmares followed me until I returned for our 30th reunion. I still felt as an outcast, but I was voted most changed - and the nightmares have stopped. The only thing is is that I've not changed - they have. This book highlights the trauma bullying can cause. But I agree, it's not them that destroys us; it's how we respond. Teens have to be strong - during a time of life that is full of insecurity. We adults must be observant and ALWAYS intervene. Share this book.

Because first of all, it's one of the many reasons that Ashley is the way she is. And Matt has flaws too. I love how the author made a guy that is authentic. Yes, he's swoony and Ashley is totally in love with him, but he's... not perfect. He can be a douche. He still cares about his rep. And he's stupid. See? A normal high school boy. But the most interesting part here is that Ashley talks to herself. OKAY. So we all talk to our self. But Ashley actually sees her Older self. In the mirror. And they're having normal conversations. If I tell you anything else I risk spoilers on how this amazing tale plays out. YOU HAVE TO READ THIS BOOK! If you have ever been bullied. If you have ever felt crazy because you were different from others. If you have wondered if you were going to overcome the odds. Ashley's story will sadden you and inspire you at the same time. As the victim of bullies when I was young, and even when I was grown up I related to Ashley's story very closely. I wasn't bullied as badly as she is, but really, bullying is a personal thing. We all handle it in our own way. At times I found myself screaming, internally, at her to wake up and see what she was doing, but I knew that wasn't how it worked. At other times I just wanted to hold her and tell her I understood. And other times I cheered with her and cried as she tried to pick up the pieces and start again. That's how amazingly Aimee Salter brings her character to life. When I'd finished the last page I wanted to call Ashley up and tell her how much I loved her. She was that real to me. Read this book. You won't be disappointed.
