

Tronzo's welcome collection of eight scholarly articles, some newly written for this book and some revised and republished, ranges from the possibility of Constantine's patronage in the fourth century, to the building of New St. Peter's, to the use of the monument as model and symbol in the 20th century. The section on Bernini's work at the Vatican could form a book all on its own. This is by far the best book on St. Peter's Basilica that I have come across.
