

This is a book that fills in the gaps. One can be an avid gardener and not really have any training in relevant scientific subjects, such as botany. Reading this book will not completely solve that problem. However, it is a step in the right direction. Having taken a botany course as an undergraduate, and being an avid gardener, I find this book to be highly useful in bridging gaps in my own knowledge. The material is approachable, so one does not really need a formal background in biology or plant science to benefit from reading it.

The appearance of this book is very similar to "Latin for Gardeners: Over 3,000 Plant Names Explained and Explored" Lorraine Harrison which was also published by the University Of Chicago Press. Just like the other book, this one has beautiful pictures of plants and depicts their stems, leaves and flowers in most of the pictures. I use this and the other book as a reference for drawing plants so this is a very helpful book for me. As for the actual information in this book, it is quite useful. It talks about subjects such as soil pH, organic matter, plant breeding and plant hormones. It also tells you why your plant might not be growing as well as you think it should and how to fix those problems. This is a great book for the gardener and the artist.
