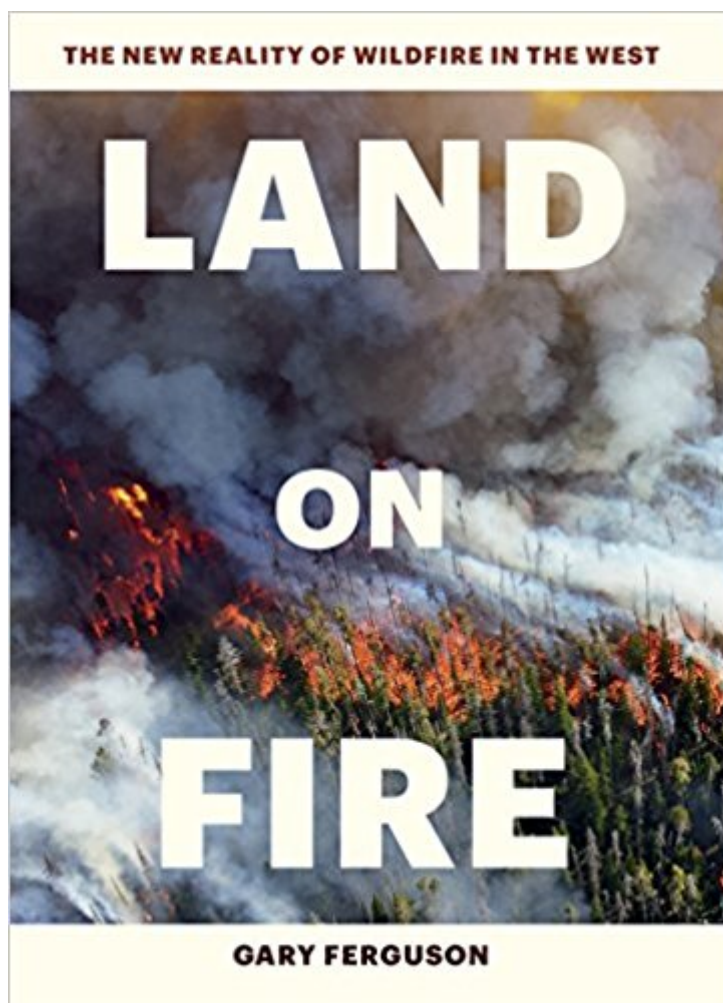


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Land On Fire: The New Reality Of Wildfire In The West

As a retired firefighter with over thirty years of trying to help solve the perplexing problem of wild fire and its impacts, I was impressed with Gary Ferguson's in-depth study, *Land on Fire*, and particularly with its conclusion; the landscape is turbulent and fire behavior is not likely to change anytime soon. My futile efforts seem universal, not necessarily a byproduct of my ineptitude. Ferguson presents the dilemma with spot-on and clear analysis. The complications involved with the intricate science of burning, the unpredictability of the weather, global warming, increasing deterioration of the forest structure, and lack of funding for research and suppression all contribute to a problem that defies resolution. Using historical data and anecdotes, accompanied by stunning photographs depicting the fury of wild fires across the country, the author presents a masterful description of where firefighting has travelled, what complexities affect suppression efforts, insight into successes and failures, and prospects for the future. I found the information very informative, even after twenty-four years of retirement, because I have witnessed a recent increase in the number and size of fires, caused by the shrinking of the wildland urban interface areas and the other factors noted. It's disturbing and the answers are very elusive. This book is a great source of information for those who care about the problem, and even for those who are only vaguely concerned, because it sheds light on a growing menace that threatens all of us and warns of the uncertainty of solving it in a timely fashion. It reinforces the need for public insistence on leaders who recognize the need to face the challenges posed by human contribution to climate change and its footprint on the earth where we live. There must be leaders, as the author asserts, that have the wisdom and courage to neither deny the challenges nor shrink in the face of

Ferguson writes extremely well and makes his subject both accessible and easy to understand in terms of cause and effect. His photographs are stunning in themselves, and aid understanding. He explains, for instance, how foresters in the past took stances that encouraged the build-up of brush until massive fires could not be stopped and only a few major trees with thick bark remained. The forests in general would benefit from occasional smaller fires burning off old deadwood and litter, making it into nutrients and allowing seeds to sprout in clearings. But the North American continent is drying and warming. He shows that the extended fire season and continued over-abstraction of freshwater have combined to guarantee stands of dying trees and massive fires blazing for months. Lightning and human activity, including downed power lines, are the main causes of fires. We also learn about Standing Firefighting Orders, and forensic fire science. That means tracing how a fire started, what caused it to spread and what fanned or enabled it. Ladder trees, jumping crown fires, flying sparks and valleys all play a part. We learn how to protect a house against such fires well in advance. I'm really glad that the experts in this extraordinary field are able to publish their knowledge so we can all benefit. Not least, all the people we meet in the course of this book, employed partly because of fires; the meteorologist, the heli pilot, the computer data modeller, the equipment manufacturers and medics, and of course the brave guys and girls out there in rough country with a radio and a Pulaski tool.
